A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR...

One of the most effective and powerful biblical ministries out there is Life Action Ministries. Life Action Ministries' (LifeAction.org) stated mission is: "To ignite Christ-centered movements of revival among God's people that display His glory and advance His kingdom throughout the world." An incredibly effective resource Life Action Ministries offers is their magazine *Revive*, which has been a source of encouragement (and conviction!) for many years. This high quality publication is free, both in print and online. I recommend that you explore what this ministry has to offer for your own spiritual growth.

This month's Revive issue (Used with permission: Revive, Life Action Ministries, Volume 48, Issue 1, Copyright @ 2017) focuses on "clearing your conscience" through genuine repentance that leads to action. I want to share a short article with you on pages 24-25. The title, "What's Your Excuse?" challenges us to examine why we haven't sought reconciliation in our broken relationships. I hope it challenges you as much as it did me.

Clearing your conscience can be hard work, and there are always plenty of reasons not to do it! Here are a few of the most common:

"It happened a really long time ago." Where does the Bible teach that time turns wrong things into right things?

"They have moved away." Hmmm. Have you heard of the Internet?

"It was such a small thing." If it's so small, why do you still remember it? The size of an offense isn't the issue.

"Things have gotten better." Good feelings are no substitute for justice, forgiveness, and restitution. "It will harm my reputation."

Humility 101 usually involves this. But take heart, God gives grace to the humble.

Your Favorite Worship Language

The other day, as I was researching the hymn "One Day", I was laughing as I read the origin of J. Wilber Chapman's habit of writing down poems for the purpose of creating songs for the church to sing. I thought the "worship wars" were a new phenomenon that only we had to deal with today. Evidently not!

When Chapman was a young pastor, he was concerned that his congregation seemed to listen to and memorize the Bible, but were not moved to action. An evangelist at heart who would eventually serve as a full-time evangelist, joining D. L. Moody in the 1890s and then later head his own campaigns under the sponsorship of John Converse and in partnership with the Presbyterian General Assembly, he anguished over their inaction. One of the things he strongly felt was that the tool of music could help move his church to put their head and heart knowledge into action. With that in mind, he approached his consistory about the congregation singing newer worship songs in their services. The board gave him a resounding "No"! One elder even stood and declared that if the words weren't printed in their hymnal, they weren't from God.

Devastated by this response, he went to see his friend D. L. Moody to vent. Of course many of the songs he wanted to introduce he had heard Ira Sankey and a large choir of voices sing at Moody's crusades, so I am sure he expected Moody to join him in denouncing his congregation! However, Moody shared with Chapman that while music indeed was a tool that through the work of the Holy Spirit could help move the soul, the problem he had was not hard hearts and a hatred of new songs, but the fear that those new songs would replace the hymns his people had come to love and had such meaning for them. Moody's counsel was to honor the hymnal while at the same time bringing new songs in carefully. He told Chapman to introduce new songs by soloists or by choir, and to make a point of printing the words out for the congregation and placing those words in the pew racks with the hymnals.

Interestingly, this plan not only worked, but as his congregation realized his intentions were not to replace their beloved hymnal, they started to embrace some of the new music. And the congregation also began to become active in their community, serving and sharing. Chapman then felt compelled to challenge his people to write their own "new songs". This practice is what led him to write hymns himself. An interesting side note to this story is that the very elder who had made such a bold proclamation about the old hymnal approached Chapman a few years later and asked if he could head a committee to select a new hymnal for the church that would keep the best of the old hymnal while incorporating the best of the new songs! I share this story with you because it is our story today as well. We have a wealth of great music that has challenged us, comforted us, taught us and moved us for years. We also live in a time where new music is abundantly accessible. It is important for us to balance the depth of the old with the best of the new, and do so with an eye on the integrity of both the lyric and the notes!

When we gather to worship, we each bring our own worship language, that with which we are comfortable and allows us to express worth to our God. However, when we come together it isn't only about our individual worship language, but about the language of others with whom we gather as well. That is what family worship looks like. I love the fact that we as a body intentionally seek to honor one another's worship language. I also love the fact that we are sensitive to the outsider without watering down our theology or sacrificing what is excellent! And probably what I like the best is the number of times I have had those I consider champions of their favorite style of music come to me and tell me how something we have done in another style has moved them or taught them something new about our God. That tells me we are growing together.

This approach to corporate worship is intentional. We ask our worship leaders to be sensitive to all the worship languages in our church. But we also ask them first and foremost to shape our worship narrative around the preaching theme and Scripture that is central to that day's service. That may mean an imbalance in worship styles in an individual service, but we then look at our services as a group to make sure that we are balanced over time. We value and wish to honor each worship language while helping all of us to grow and become more fluent in a common worship language that combines the best of all. And like Chapman, our hope is that we all leave humming the sermon through the power of music in such a way that we are not only hearers of the Word, but doers also!

Ephesians 5:17-21

"Therefore, do not be unwise, but understand what the will of the Lord is. And do not be drunk with wine, in which is dissipation; but be filled with the Spirit, speaking to one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody in your heart to the Lord, giving thanks always for all things to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, submitting to one another in the fear of God.
