

GOD IS ON THE MOVE!

I was recently reminded of a powerful song by 7eventh Time Down called "God is on the Move." The chorus of the song goes, "God is on the move, on the move. Hallelujah. God is on the move in many mighty ways." The song reminds us that God is working behind that scenes to build His Kingdom. This fall, LFC will be involved in building His Kingdom through three specific ministries: "Christianity Explored" Class, Sussex Serve and our Missions Conference. I'd love to share with you more about each of these ministries, and how you and your family can get involved. Our prayer is that each of these ministries powerfully proclaim the Gospel of Jesus as He builds His kingdom!

CHRISTIANITY EXPLORED

Christianity Explored is seven-week study on Jesus from the Gospel of Mark. Mark 1:1 begins with these words - "The beginning of the gospel about Jesus Christ, the Son of God...." Christianity is all about the good

news of Jesus Christ. This class takes participants through a seven- week adventure of seeing and understanding the identity, mission and call of Jesus. If you have questions about Christianity or are a new

SACRED VS. SECULAR: WHAT IS RIGHT FOR OUR CORPORATE WORSHIP.

"If therefore the whole church should assemble together and all speak in tongues and ungifted men or unbelievers enter, will they not say that you are mad? But if all prophesy and an unbeliever or an ungifted man enters, he is convicted by all and is called to account by all. The secrets of his heart are disclosed and so he will fall on his face and worship God, declaring that God is certainly among you."

1 Corinthians 14:23-25

This passage specifically points out that the use of the gift of tongues in the context of the worship service could be confusing and confuse the observing unbeliever to reach a false conclusion about the worshipers. Later in that same passage, the use of tongues in the assembly is limited to a few and requires someone to interpret for others. It isn't much more of a stretch for us to conclude that unexplained "Christianese" could cause the same problem! Or an overuse of musical forms that are foreign to the culture we live in.

Think of the things we hold to be traditional. Isaac Watts began writing songs for worship that were not strictly from scripture, especially from the Book of Psalms in the late 1600s and early 1700s, calling this new form "hymns". Until then, the only songs allowed in the worship service of the church were derived directly from Scripture. When Reformation leader John Calvin initiated the practice of creating verse translations of the Psalms in the common vernacular to be sung, that was rejected at first by many as too liberal! The first Tune Books (Hymnals) weren't published until the early 1700's. It was evangelist George Whitfield who began to use hymns instead of traditional psalm singing during his revivals of the mid-1700's, as a part of the Great Awakenina.

The formation in 1817 of the American Sunday School Union fostered the start of writing children's music, the children who as adults gravitated to the new "gospel" music style. This Gospel song style was greatly popularized by the Moody/Sankey revivals of the late 1800's which featured soloists (Sankey and others) and the use of a choir, something that churches began to model on Sunday mornings.

Even our traditional instrumentation is not all that traditional. The organ was considered an abomination by some when it was first used in the church in the late 600s, eventually a papal bullarium was issued in the 900s banning it from worship, a bullarium that was since rescinded. The piano was considered secular and not allowed in church until the necessity of the westward movement in the United States made it commonplace in the late 1800s. Many still to this day do not allow any instruments as a part of their worship services. So the question gets raised, how do we know what is appropriate for the church?

Arthur Holmes wrote a book with the title All Truth is God's Truth. His premise was that we have polarized the church around the terms secular and sacred and have dropped the responsibility to analyze everything in our world no matter the source to the standard of the scripture, thereby depriving ourselves of many joys, placing a false barrier between us and the world, and permeating our own traditions with false teaching! The terms sacred and secular were defined by the church in the dark ages. Unfortunately, we have embraced the concept and in the process the church has abandoned its place in defining what is "good" in art.

Personal preferences rather than biblical truths have incorrectly been the defining criteria for ages. In the 1400's it was decided that only perfect intervals (octaves, 4ths and 5ths) were appropriate for use in the church, that other harmonizations were "secular" and not to be used in worship. The tritone (quamented 4th/diminished 5th) was accorded a special place, called "diabolos in musica" (the devil in music) and banned from music altogether. When Martin Luther brought the hymn "A Mighty Fortress Is Our God" into the church, he broke the rules and was heavily criticized for it. The melody was a common tavern tune and used "secular" harmonization. Even though this was a common practice to put new words of news to familiar tunes so that the message could be more easily heard, it wasn't normal in the church of that day. It is said that at the time he was criticized far more for this than posting the 95 Theses on the Wittenberg Door! Of course, our hymn books today are filled with this "secular" harmonization.

We often argue about the beat or the form or instrumentation, but not enough about what really matters, the content! This probably stems from the fact that all of us know what we like, but few of us spend the time evaluating the biblical truth in the lyrics. I believe this is especially true because several of our favorite hymns might be found lacking or because the new song with the awesome melody line might be deemed inadequate in the truth department. We are called by scripture to "speak to one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody with your heart to the Lord" (Eph. 5:19 NASB). We have a variety of forms with which to express our worship.

But we need to evaluate the content for truth and we need to evaluate the form for relevance to our congregation and the world around us that may visit our services. It is important that we look back to the traditions of the church while embracing what is good today. We shouldn't limit ourselves to manmade terms and preferences, but remember that all truth is God's truth and we should use the best of what is available to us to worship God, encourage one another and proclaim the Gospel!
