A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR...

The Easter season is such an exciting and important time in the life of the church. For many of us, the various services and celebrations have been a part of our Christian experience from childhood. For others, however, some of these services and celebrations are brand new and unfamiliar. As we prepare our hearts for the celebration of the resurrection of Jesus on Easter morning, here's a very brief "primer" on the services and celebration of Holy Week.

Why "Holy Week?": Holy Week is a time in the life of the church that we set aside to prepare our hearts and minds for the celebration of the central and foundational hope that we have as Christians—the literal, physical resurrection of Jesus from the dead. Paul tells us in I Corinthians 15: And if Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile; you are still in your sins. 18 Then those also who have fallen asleep in Christ are lost. 19 If only for this life we have hope in Christ, we are to be pitied more than all men. 20 But Christ has indeed been raised from the dead...

Palm Sunday: Palm Sunday commemorates Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem at the beginning of week that would end in His death and resurrection. The name "Palm Sunday" comes from the account in the Gospels where people laid palm branches on the ground for Jesus to ride over as a sign of honor and victory. The people expected Jesus to enter Jerusalem and reign as a political king on an earthly throne. Jesus, however, had another mission to fulfill, to be an even greater King and Messiah.

Maundy Thursday: Maundy Thursday commemorates the Last Supper that Jesus celebrated with His disciples and His subsequent betrayal and arrest. The word "maundy" comes from the Latin word mandatum, which is translated roughly "a new command" which echoes the words of Jesus when He took the Last Supper with His disciples and told them in John 13:34: "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another."

A Bird's-Eye View of LFC's Mission Outreach:

Our church supports 30 missionary families (serving with 22 different agencies) and 8 retired families.

Who are they?



Twelve of our "global partners" serve under 4 agencies: Global Serve, Camino Global, Equip and Cru.

Eighteen of our missionaries serve with other agencies .

Of the 54 individuals we support 18 are over 65 with 12 over 70! (What are you doing with your retirement?)

Six are single women

Where do our missionaries serve?

Eighteen serve outside the United States:

Three are in Slovenia 2 each in Spain, Mexico, and Kenya. Others are in Chad, Nigeria, Japan, Germany, Iraq, Bolivia, South Korea and India.



Twelve are based here in the states, 4 of them (Allen's, Alonso's, Buerer's and Lindsey's) make frequent trips to various countries for ministry.

Besides individual missionaries, our budget includes two ministries: Today's Choice and InterSenegal.

What do they do?



Thirteen of our missionaries' primary work is ministry support. This includes training nationals, development, administration, etc. Ten of our missionaries are in direct evangelism. Three in church planting work. Two in medical work. Two in education.

What's new?

Have you seen our new display of prayer cards for all our missionaries?

To the right of the Welcome Desk there are individual information/prayer cards for each of our 30 missionaries. We encourage you to select one or 2 (or more!) people who are taking God's Good News around the world and get to know them AND pray for them. The card is small enough to fit in your Bible. The cards will remind you to pray for our "global partners." You can receive their regular newsletter by contacting them bymail...their address is on their cards.

Of special note:



Phil and Arleen Blycker are completing 50 years of ministry this year, having served in

several Latin American countries as music educators.

Also, Beth Hanna is "retiring" after over 35 years, but will stay in Mexico as a volunteer with her agency.

Serina Klotz is moving from Colombia to Bolivia in January (2018) and Justin and Lluvia Hoste are leaving Argentina for Mexico in January.

How can you get involved?

God calls all His children to work to "expand His kingdom." What you can do:

- 1. "Adopt" one of our global partners. Pray for him/her. Send an encouraging note, or birthday card. Receive their regular newsletter. Let them know you pray for them.
- 2. Go on one of LFC's mission trips. (Information will be available soon.)
- 3. Become informed of what's happening in countries where Christians experience persecution. Then pray!

As I was listening to music while planning the Easter Cantata this year, an unusual title caught my eye; "Love Took His Breath Away". What a concept. God's love for us had Him put the plan of redemption in play right from the beginning in the garden. God's love for us had Jesus empty Himself and come to earth as a man. God's love for us is what drove our Lord to the cross. God's love for us is what compelled Him to willingly lay down His life there. God's love for US! All of us, mired in our sin and so unworthy of that love.

That is a message that transforms lives. We matter to God, and He has done what was needed to restore the fellowship that was broken by sin. It is not what we have done, but what He has done.
