Church Family,

I hope your fall is shaping up to be a good one! As much as I enjoy the freedom summer brings, it's always a little comforting to get back into the routine that this season brings—with family, church and school. As we settle back into these routines, I wanted to share a few of my current favorite resources for spiritual growth and development. I'm often asked about what I would recommend as helpful books, websites and articles for either general spiritual growth or for digging deeper into a certain subjects. Hopefully, the following list will be helpful to that end. None of these resources are new, but instead are older treasures that I have just discovered or rediscovered, or have continued to appreciate for many years. All of them have been a personal help to me in my Christian walk this last year.

Two commentaries on the Gospel of Mark: In my preparation for my weekly sermons on the Gospel of Mark, I have found two very good commentaries. Both are very readable and accessible, and I have found them helpful not only for sermon preparation, but also for personal study and encouragement. Mark, in the Tyndale New Testament Commentary series, by R. Alan Cole is easy to read, but presents some excellent insights into this wonderful Gospel. I also love

- William L. Lane's The Gospel According to Mark in The New International Commentary on the New Testament series. This is a little more in depth than Cole's, but is still very readable, and though it's a commentary, I am struck by Lane's consistent application of the text to our daily lives. I love this volume for both study and personal encouragement.

It's Christmas!

It's Christmas, the bells are ringing, and I feel like shouting "Joy to the World"!" It is our responsibility to share this hope that we have! With the radio already playing Christmas songs and people preparing for the holidays, we have the opportunity to jump into the conversation and point our family, friends, neighbors and coworkers towards the Biblical foundation of Christmas. Hope is here, the Savior of the world has come!

Last year we tried a matinee performance on Saturday and were pleased to see the positive response. We will offer it again! However, we are adding a Friday performance back into the schedule. But we are moving it to one of our partner churches, celebrating Sussex Christian Reformed Church's newly remodeled sanctuary. We will be back at LFC on Saturday at 3:00 p.m. and Sunday at 6:30 p.m.
