A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR..

Every year or so, I use one newsletter article to share some of the books, websites and resources that have been especially helpful to me in my own spiritual journey. I know what a blessing it is when many of you share a meaningful book or helpful article with me, so I hope this is a way to return the spiritual favor!

I had an opportunity to do a little more reading than I usually do, thanks to my summer sabbatical. Here are a few books that I found especially challenging and helpful.

- Walking in the Spirit by Kenneth Berding (Crossway, 2011). This little book is wonderful examination of what it means to live a victorious, Spirit-led life as shown us in Romans 8. Even though Berding is a professor at Biola University, this book is straightforward, easy to read, and very biblical and practical. There are also great study questions at the end of each chapter.
- The Prodigal Church: A Gentle Manifesto Against the Status Quo by Jared
 - Wilson (Crossway, 2015). This is one of the best books about the direction of many modern, evangelical churches in America. What I loved about this book was that it wasn't an anary tirade, or un-Christ like rant against some of the dangerous trends developing in the modern American church; rather, it was a humble, gentle, loving, and biblical response. I found it both encouraging and challenging. This would be a great read for those who are in leadership and help make decisions about direction, programs, and ministries in the church.
- Spiritual Maturity by J. Oswald Sanders (Moody Press, 1962, 1994). I re-read this powerful book this summer for probably the 5th time. Sanders has a very practical way of explaining what it means to be spiritually mature and how to apply what the Bible says about it to our lives. Sanders is also the author of one of my favorite books about leadership, entitled Spiritual Leadership. I have read that book closer to 10 times, so I thought I better mix it up a bit! Both of these books are classic books that one should revisit often. They have both been a tremendous help to my walk with the Lord.

As much as I love summer, I really love fall. I think of it as a time of newness, refreshment and excitement. The changing colors of the leaves remind me of God's power, glory and majesty as He paints the countryside with His artist's brush. I love the verses in Psalm 96:11-12, "Let the heavens rejoice, let the earth be glad; let the sea resound, and all that is in it; let the fields be jubilant, and everything in them. Then all the trees of the forest will sing for joy."

I would like to take a moment to encourage you to use fall as a great time to get plugged back into a God's Word. Gathering to worship together on Sunday mornings is an incredible time for us to, first and foremost, gather to worship the God of Creation, the King of Kings, and Our Lord & Savior. We have Our Daily Bread devotionals, The Upper Room devotional, and we have a plan to help you read through the Bible in a year that was formulated by one of our own (Leroy Lindsey). The most important thing is that you get into a routine of being in God's Word regularly.

"And so, from the day we heard, we have not ceased to pray for you, asking that you may be filled with the knowledge of his will in all spiritual wisdom and understanding, so as to walk in a manner worthy of the Lord, fully pleasing to him, bearing fruit in every good work and increasing in the knowledge of God." Colossians 1:9-10

There are several components to this passage that I find motivating as I think about our student ministry and what we are trying to accomplish. Our students, your children and grandchildren are at such a stage of life that they need prayer and encouragement to continue to pursue and walk with Jesus!

The second thing that I take away from this passage is the centrality of Paul's desire to see that his readers are "filled with the knowledge of his will" that they may "walk in a manner worthy of the Lord." Who doesn't want that for their children, right? One specific area of emphasis for the students in our youth ministry has been pointing out the need to live in biblical community with one another to encourage and build one another up.

BACK TO THE BASICS

Football season is now officially in full swing. One of my favorite football coach quotes was by Vince Lombardi - a guy who coached the Green Bay Packers from 1958 - 1967 and went on to win six division titles, five NFL championships, and two Super Bowls (I and II). Yet, as Lombardi walked into training camp in the summer of 1961, he said to his players, "Gentlemen, this is a football."

What was his secret ingredient for success? I believe that it was his obsession with getting back to the basics of football. His team would become the best in the league at the tasks everyone else took for granted. This 'getting back to the basics' concept is critical, even in the church. As Christians, God has given us His word as a guide. Psalm 119:105 says "Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path."

With this in mind, I wanted to share something that God taught me recently and how it is helping me to get back to the basics in our missions ministry. I've really enjoyed serving within the missions committee and working alongside our missions chairperson Janet Neidhardt. Janet's wisdom, life experiences, and heart for the Lord have been an inspiration and encouragement to me. Recently we were talking about how to be a church that effectively supports our current global partners and sends out future global partners. How can we be confident as a committee that we are being good stewards of the funding given to missions? As I looked through our missions policy, God used some verses to challenge and refocus my thinking.

The Bible passage that stood out most to me was Matthew 9:35-38 which says, "And Jesus went throughout all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues and proclaiming the gospel of the kingdom and healing every disease and every affliction. When he saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest." English Standard Version (ESV)

This passage convicted me that I first need to aet back to the basics...that there are two main areas we need to make sure are at our foundation. One is that compassion needs to guide our approach to missions. Jesus looked out at the crowds and had compassion on them. I need to continually ask God to give me a broken heart for the lost. Jesus describes these people as harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. Hearing these words struck a chord with me. Jesus' mission is the most important mission of all. When we view people as God views them, He can use that in powerful ways for His Kingdom.

Another thing the Lord showed me was the importance of prayer. Jesus calls his followers to pray earnestly for the Lord to send out laborers into His harvest. I never noticed the end of this verse before where it says "His" harvest. It's about Him, not us! How often do I pray for workers to be sent to the harvest? How often do you? God really certainly convicted me in this area.

As we approach our upcoming missions conference on October 25th-27th, let's try to get back to the basics. Please pray that God will use this conference to reflect this year's theme taken from the book of Esther - "For such a time is this." Pray that we all would see that the time is now for missions. Pray that God would send out workers from LFC into HIS harvest field. Please look at the attached schedule and prayerfully consider where God is leading you to serve in the area of missions. The task of missions is great, but our God is greater!
